

SENIOR BOARDING BOYS YEARS 7 - 11

Items marked with a * must be purchased through the School Shop.

- * 2 Pairs regulation School Shop trousers
- * School Blazer
- * 1 Black V-neck pullover with Wyvern (Optional – for wear under blazer)
- * 2 School ties
- 8 White school shirts with formal 'classic' collar
- 6 Pairs grey or black socks
- 1 Pair **plain black polishable** leather shoes
- * School scarf or **plain black** scarf (optional). NB Other scarves may **not** be worn.
- Jacket, anorak or coat (gaberdine, cotton or acrylic, **not** leather or fur)

(Pupils who cycle to school should wear a reflecting safety strip over the coat)

Summer Dress

2 plain white short-sleeved School shirts instead of shirt and tie
All the other items as above

During the Summer Term the wearing of tie and blazer in school is not required as long as pupils remain within the regulations published at the start of the term, but Note 1 below relating to travel to school applies at all times.

- NB**
1. School uniform should be worn neatly while attending school and in travelling to school unless an explicit exception has been made by a member of staff. Outer garments - raincoats, anoraks etc - must be smart and without logos.
 2. Normal wear around the school is **shirt, tie and blazer**. Pullovers may be worn in addition to but not instead of blazers in very cold weather.
 3. BLAZERS must be smart and in good condition. They must be worn during the school day as well as for all sports fixtures and all formal occasions.
 4. Boys in and below the Sixth form may wear colours blazers if full colours have been awarded. Ties must be worn with *colours* blazers at all times.
 5. T shirts/vests should not be visible under shirts.
 6. Hats and caps may not be worn with School uniform at any time.

SIXTH FORM

General

When accepting a place in the Sixth Form at Queen's College *the student accepts and agrees to abide by the rules for the wearing of uniform as outlined here and in the general rules for school uniform.*

Uniform is to be worn throughout the school day unless the student is involved in an activity which precludes the wearing of such.

The emphasis on dress in the Sixth Form is essentially an **executive** style. The final decision as to whether the student's uniform is suitable lies with the Head of Sixth Form. Students who do not conform to the required standard may be asked to go home or back to the boarding house to change into more suitable attire.

A dark formal suit with or without waistcoat. (Waistcoats are not to be worn without a jacket).

A "colours" blazer with dark trousers (Ties must be worn at all times when wearing a blazer).

A Sixth Form or School-authorized tie worn with a formal classic shirt. (Shirts in bold colours or excessively patterned are not acceptable)

Shirts must be neatly tucked into the trousers *at all times*.

A plain V necked jumper in a dark colour may be worn under a jacket.

Jackets must be worn during the school day and when conducting school tours of the school or on other formal occasions.

Shoes must be in black, polishable leather.

2. MARKING
Every article of clothing, including underwear and all other possessions **MUST** be marked with your son's name. Outer articles of sports clothing must be marked on the outside, on the front right hand side wherever possible.

4. HAIR
Hair should be its uniform natural colour, clean, tidy and cut short in an orthodox manner.
