

SENIOR DAY GIRLS YEARS 7 - 11

Items marked with a * must be purchased through the School Shop.

- * Regulation black pleated skirt
- * School blazer
- * Black V-neck pullover with Wyvern (Optional – for wear under blazer)
- * School tie
- * White school shirt with formal 'classic' collar
- Black tights
- Plain black polishable** leather shoes. Pumps must have a rubber sole. (low heels, approx 1½", only; no platforms, stilettos or fashion pumps). Shoes must not be patent leather.
- * School scarf or **plain black** scarf (optional).
- Jacket, anorak or coat (gaberdine, cotton or acrylic, **not** leather or fur)
- Plain white or flesh coloured bras

Girls who wish to wear trousers in place of a skirt with their school uniform are required to purchase their trousers through the school shop, Pinder and Tuckwell.

(Pupils who cycle to school should wear a reflecting safety strip over the coat)

Summer Dress

Plain white short-sleeved School blouse instead of shirt and tie
All the other items as above

Note 1 below relating to travel to school applies at all times.

- NB**
1. School uniform should be worn neatly while attending school and in travelling to school unless an explicit exception has been made by a member of staff. Outer garments - raincoats, anoraks etc - must be smart and without logos.
 2. Normal wear around the school is **shirt and tie** (or **short sleeved blouse** in summer) **and blazer**.
 3. Pullovers may be worn during the day, but blazers must be worn to and from School.
 4. BLAZERS must be smart and in good condition. They must be worn for all sports fixtures and formal occasions.
 5. Girls in and below the Sixth form may wear colours blazers if full colours have been awarded. Ties must be worn with *colours* blazers at all times.
 6. Hats or caps may not be worn with School uniform at any time.
 7. Black tights must be worn or white ankle socks.

SIXTH FORM

General

When accepting a place in the Sixth Form at Queen's College *the student accepts and agrees to abide by the rules for the wearing of uniform as outlined here and in the general rules for school uniform.*

Uniform is to be worn throughout the school day unless the student is involved in an activity which precludes the wearing of such.

The emphasis on dress in the Sixth Form is essentially an **executive** style. The final decision as to whether the student's uniform is suitable lies with the Head of Sixth Form. Students who do not conform to the required standard may be asked to go home or back to the boarding house to change into more suitable attire.

- Either** A formal suit (with skirt or trousers). Worn with,
A formal classic shirt and Sixth Form or other authorised tie.
- Or** A plain business-like blouse/collarless top.

Blouses and tops may be worn outside the skirt or trousers if the blouse or top is tailored and does not show the midriff.

Low cut necklines or ornate tops are not acceptable.

Tops or sleeveless vest tops must not be worn either under or over shirts/blouses

Skirts and trousers must be formal and neat.

Excessively flared trousers or skirts which are, in the opinion of the Head of Sixth Form, too long or too short are not acceptable.

Sensible jewellery, worn in an executive context, is acceptable.

Shoes must have heels which are both sensible and practical for the school day.

NOTES

1. SCHOOL SHOP

The School Shop is open during term time on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 1.00 pm - 5.00 pm and, generally, a week before the beginning and after the end of each term. 2. MARKING

Every article of clothing, including underwear and all other possessions **MUST** be marked with your daughter's name. Outer articles of sports clothing must be marked on the outside, on the front right hand side wherever possible.

3. Will parents kindly ensure that all articles of clothing are in a good state of repair at the beginning of each term.

4. MAKE UP

Years 7 - 11: Make-up, chains, bracelets, rings and other jewellery are not allowed.

5. EARRINGS

Girls may wear one plain flat stud in each earlobe if the ear is pierced.

Sixth Form: Sixth Form girls may wear make-up and jewellery which are **unobtrusive** ie a single ring, **non**-pendant earrings in each earlobe and/or a single gold or silver chain necklace.

6. HAIR

Hair must be its uniform natural colour and tied back with a black accessory if otherwise it would reach the collar. PLEASE NOTE NO HIGHLIGHTS for Years 7-11.
