Scholarship Applications For 11+ Candidates



We are offering candidates the opportunity to sit the 11+ scholarship exam in the form of online cognitive ability tests, (CATs) on a choice of three Saturdays in November.

Should any of these dates be unsuitable, alternative arrangements can be made, however the final deadline for all applications is **Friday 14th December 2018**. In such cases, candidates will sit their CATs on an individual basis before the assessment and interview date in January.

On **Monday 14th January** candidates will be invited to an interview with the Head Teacher, Dr Lorraine Earps. On the same day they will take part in specific assessments relevant to their scholarship application such as Music, Performing Arts, Sport and Art. Candidates should prepare for these assessments as outlined in the scholarship information attached. Candidates applying for an Academic scholarship will not undergo additional assessments; the CATs will provide evidence of exceptional aptitude in this area.

NB Results of CATs will only be available on request, after the scholarship process is complete.

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The Queen's College Academic Scholarship



Queen's scholars are very much part of the vibrant community. We have many causes for celebration this year with excellent achievements in public examinations. The university destinations for our Academic Scholars include coveted places at Oxford, Cambridge, Durham, Exeter, Bath, Imperial, Loughborough, Manchester and Birmingham.

Queen's College offers a number of Academic Scholarships each year. Scholarship candidates are assessed on their aptitude and potential across a range of disciplines.

Requirements

Interview: Every Academic Scholarship candidate will be invited for an interview with Senior School members of staff, providing an opportunity for the Senior School to discover more about the candidate's potential, ability and interests. Staff will then make their decision on any scholarship award based on this interview and the outcome of the exams/testing.

11+ candidates will sit exams using baseline CAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) testing in a range of subjects. Students are not expected to practice or revise for these tests as they are a measure of cognitive ability. A reference will be requested from the candidate's current school, with special reference to the candidate's academic strengths, attitude to work, character, behaviour and interests.

Scholarship



Performing Arts Scholars enrich everyone's experience at Queen's. The evidence of their talent contributes to the rich, creative culture of the school. The depth and range of opportunity for performance in dance and drama or work behind the scenes is exceptional. The College has unique partnerships that open opportunities for our students to work with professionals in specialist areas of the performing arts. With South West Theatre Ballet in residence and opportunities for work in film and on the stage, our students have a real sense of the professional possibilities.

Academically, Drama at Queen's is a popular choice at both G.C.S.E and A Level with pupils consistently achieving outstanding results. Many of our students have achieved the high accolade of places at leading universities such as Birmingham, Warwick, Oxford School of Acting, R.A.D.A. and Guildford School of acting to name a few. Our dance students have recently taken up places at LIPA and Chichester University.

Requirements

- Both the practical skills and future potential of each candidate are taken into account
- Demonstrated ability and an active interest in an aspect of Performing Arts is essential
- Proven acting, musical, or dancing ability or an interest and ability in the technical aspects of the subject - sound, lighting or design

11+ Auditions

11+ candidates must prepare **ONE** of the following options:

- One solo monologue/soliloquy from any published play text
- One solo dance piece (original or repertoire)
- One solo song from any established piece of musical theatre, (e.g. The Wizard of Oz, Les Miserables, Cats, Oliver) either unaccompanied or to a backing track provided by the candidate, (CD or iPod)

Candidates are welcome to present more than one of the above suggestions, if they so wish.

All audition pieces should be learned by heart and candidates are expected to perform without the text/lyrics. The piece should be introduced and candidates should know the context of the extract and understand what material to perform to show off their strengths. Music for dances should be on iPod or iPhone.

In addition, candidates may be required to attend workshop where they will take part in improvisation games, some vocal exercises and a choreographed dance routine. All the activities will be designed to look at the candidate's technical ability and potential as well as their willingness to collaborate and negotiate.

Expectations

We are looking for candidates with enthusiasm and commitment who will make a positive contribution to Queen's College Performing Arts. Successful 11+ candidates are usually expected to take GCSE Drama as part of their GCSE programme. All successful candidates are expected to contribute to major school productions.

Assessment, Interview and Portfolio Requirements

11+ candidates will take part in a 30 minute group drawing assessment in the Art Department. They will then have an interview to discuss their portfolio. The portfolio should demonstrate their passion and the extra work that they do in their own time, as well as art work completed at school.

Expectations

Successful candidates will be expected to spend time in the Art Department over and above the normal lessons. They will be expected to take GCSE Art as part of their GCSE programme as well as taking a full part in the student life of the Art Department.

The Queen's College Music Scholarship



Our musical facilities are excellent, with a spacious, purpose-built Music School complete with practice rooms and music technology suite. This adjoins the Queen's Hall auditorium – a 570-seat, fully equipped concert hall, complete with Steinway Model D concert grand piano and 30-stop pipe organ with mobile console, as well as state-of-the art lighting and sound systems.

Queen's College has excellent instrumental teaching support with a highly qualified team of twenty visiting teachers, who cover every aspect of orchestral and band, playing from double bass to piccolo; there is also a skilled line-up of keyboard teachers and vocal teachers, specialising in jazz, modern and classical music. Queen's music scholars have wonderful opportunities playing with our Orchestra-in-Residence, the Southern Sinfonia.

We have two orchestras, the exuberant Swing Band, Wind Band, College Choir and a variety of specialist ensembles focusing on different disciplines. Our Chamber Music programme allows students to take a lead in ensemble practice and have students who run their own bespoke groups. The Music Department enjoys performing a diverse range of musical styles from medieval choral to instrumental modern jazz and everything in between. Students take part in number of ensemble and orchestral events throughout the year, with a busy calendar of recitals and concerts.

Requirements

Music Scholarships are awarded on the results of auditions and musicianship tests, conducted by the Director of Music. It is not expected that exams should have been taken but the following approximate standards will serve as a guideline:

- For 11+ candidates, a standard equivalent to Grade 4

Candidates will usually be expected to be proficient on two instruments and be required to perform on both. However, those who can demonstrate exceptional ability on one instrument alone will be seriously considered. In the event of being successful, those entering Years 7 and 8 would be encouraged to take up a second instrument.

Auditions

Auditions will last between 25-30 minutes. Time will be given for a warm-up beforehand.

The following will be required of all candidates:

- To perform two pieces on their first study and one piece on any further instruments offered
- To sight-read on their first instrument
- To respond to questions about their chosen pieces
- To undertake ear tests - this will include answering questions on an unknown piece of music played to them

Plenty of opportunity will be given for candidates to give indications of their interests in the subject and any evidence of extra musical ability will also be welcomed.

Accompanists - Candidates should bring piano accompaniments for instrumental pieces. If particularly complex accompaniments are required, some advance warning would be much appreciated since there will not be an opportunity for a rehearsal together prior to the auditions.

Expectations

Candidates gaining an award will be expected to participate actively in the musical life of the school as and when required. Holders of Music Awards are expected to set an example by their standards of musicianship and their commitment to school music. Participation in some aspects of choral activity will be expected. Award holders are usually expected to take Music to at least GCSE level.

The Queen's College Sports Scholarship



Our sports scholars will benefit from the following:

- Mentoring from the relevant Head of Sport
- Exceptional coaching, including one-to-one or small group ratios where appropriate
- Access to strength and conditioning programmes where appropriate for age
- Opportunities to play sport and study overseas as part of our international sport exchange programme (Upper School)
- Video analysis feedback of performances when involved with 1st Team fixtures (Upper School)
- Playing opportunities through our extensive and competitive fixture lists
- Guidance and support for accessing local clubs, where appropriate, as well as university choices and access through elite sporting pathways
- A supportive school environment with a holistic approach to education

Requirements

11+ candidates should show strong ability or exceptional promise in some of the school's main sports, which are rugby, hockey, cricket, tennis, netball, swimming or athletics. If selected 11+ entrants are required to play at least one of these sports each school term.

All candidates will be expected to take academic entrance exams, in addition to their sporting assessments.

Assessment and Trials

Sports Scholarships are awarded on the results of assessments conducted by the Director of Sport and staff.

- All candidates will be required to attend a Sports Scholarship assessment
- Sports assessments take place as a group session and candidates are required to bring trainers, white socks, shorts/skort and T-shirt/polo shirt
- Candidates who have indicated swimming as one of their major sports should also bring their swimming attire
- The trials morning/afternoon will involve athletic testing, personality observations, game play, individual specialisms and a possible interview with a member of the Sports Department
- Evidence of achievements, (personal best times, distances, etc.) is encouraged if appropriate

Expectations

All scholarships are reviewed at the end of every key stage and continuance is dependent on conduct, attitude, participation and performance. Sports scholars will be expected to be good ambassadors for the school and demonstrate a willingness to contribute fully to the sporting and general life of the school.
