Other craft activities included making, decorating and of course eating crown biscuits in the kitchen garden club. They also enjoyed designing soldier pictures for use at a later special date this term. The national anthem has been sung and several 'King' themed stories have been enjoyed to round-off the celebrations.







Yet again the rain has affected our matches this week. #### Wild Wilderness Cuisine Class Praised by TV Expert



Inspired by the celebrity TV chef James Martin from ITV's James Martin's Saturday Morning show, and of ITV's Good Morning fame, our pupils have been foraging for wild ingredients to cook with from around the school site.

In the latest TV show, James was joined by fellow Chefs James Tanner and Hrishikesh Desai. along with regular, TV food foraging expert and author, 'The Yorkshire Forager' Alysia Vasey who taught everyone about food that can be found in hedgerows this spring.

With her teachings, our pupils went on a wild forage to create their very own wilderness cuisine preparing food in the classroom with the recommended earthier garlic flavour of three-cornered leeks, the young pea taste of sticky wild cleavers and a few gorse flowers that smell of coconut and taste of almonds (plus a few tangy dandelions).

TV food foraging expert and author, Alysia, contacted the school to praise our pupils saying, "How absolutely fantastic, I hope you all really enjoyed yourselves foraging and cooking".

#### **Camera Club**

Last week in Camera Club, vintage cameras were the stars of the show as students used them to grasp the basics of how cameras work. The cameras then featured as the subjects of their photo shoot, applying what they have learned about adjusting the aperture of their digital cameras to control the depth of field of their images.






